### **Definitions**

- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available For Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable For Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduate Employed In The Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates Taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took first available exam in the reported calendar year.

## STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The student has the right to cancel and obtain a full refund of charges (less non-refundable fees) paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. (See Item 7, below, REFUND INFORMATION, for additional details.) To request a refund, the student must submit cancellation in writing to:

### 7. REFUND INFORMATION

The student or the person, company, entity, etc. who/which has paid the tuition and/or fees has a right to a full refund of all charges, less the amount of the non-refundable fees (registration, wire, materials), if the student cancels this agreement prior to or on the first day of instruction before attending the first class, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. Only the student has the right to cancel this Enrollment Agreement, and request for class discontinuations **MUST BE IN WRITING**.

In addition, the student may withdraw from a course of instruction after the first class has started. The student or the person, company, entity, etc. who/which has paid the tuition and/or fees will receive a pro-rated refund for the unused portion of the tuition if the student has completed 60% or less of the course of instruction. **If a student completes in excess of the 60% of the course of instruction, there is no refund.** *The \$50 materials fee is only refundable if the student did not receive the materials prior to or upon enrollment.* The last day to withdraw and cancel this enrollment agreement and receive a pro-rated refund is \_\_\_\_\_ Any refund issued must be issued to the payer in the same manner in which it was paid.

*If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.*

*If the student obtains a loan to pay for the program of study, it is the student's responsibility to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund. (CEC §94911(f)). If the student defaults on a federal or state loan, both of the following may occur:(1) The federal or state government or loan guarantee agency may take action against the student, including apply any income tax refund to which the person is entitled to reduce the balance owed on the loan. (2) The student may not be eligible for any other federal student financial aid at another institution or other government financial assistance at another institution until the loan is repaid. (CEC §94911(g)(1)(2))*

Example of Pro-Rated Refund: If student completes 30 hours of a 96-hour course, and paid \$1950.00 in tuition, refund is calculated on rate per hour ( $\$1950.00 \div \text{by } 96 = \$20.31$ ) times unused hours ( $96 - 30 \text{ used hours} = 66 \text{ unused hours}$ ). So refund would be \$1,340.46 (66 hours x \$20.31 per hour). If the Institute cancels or discontinues a *course of instruction*, the Institute will issue a full refund of all charges. Refunds will be paid within 30 days of cancellation or withdrawal.
